

Troop 911 Junior Leader Job Description Assistant Senior Patrol Leader (ASPL)

Job Description: The ASPL is the second highest ranking junior leader in the troop. He is elected by the scouts for a term of 3 months, and then advances to the position of Senior Patrol Leader (SPL). The ASPL acts as the SPL in the absence of the SPL or when called upon. He also provides leadership to the other junior leaders in the troop.

Term of Office: The term of office for the Assistant Senior Patrol Leader is 3 months. A Scout may serve a maximum of two terms as Assistant Senior Patrol Leader.

Reports to: Senior Patrol Leader

Duties and Responsibilities:

- Assist the SPL in running all troop meetings, events, activities, and the annual program planning conference.
- Runs the troop in the absence of the SPL.
- Train and supervise the troop scribe, quartermaster, instructors, librarian, historian, and chaplain aide.
- Serves as a member of the patrol leaders council.
- Sets a good example.
- Enthusiastically wears the Scout uniform correctly.
- Lives by the Scout Oath and Law.
- Shows Scout spirit.

Minimum Qualifications for Assistant Senior Patrol Leader:

- Must have been a member of Troop 911 for at least 1 year.
- Must have served as a Patrol Leader, Scribe, Librarian, Historian, Quartermaster, Troop Guide, Instructor, or Senior Patrol Leader for at least six months.
- Must be a Star Scout or higher rank.
- Must have attended 85% of Troop meetings in the 6 months preceding appointment; must have attended 5 of the preceding 6 Troop weekend outings or 8 of the preceding 11 outings.
- Must demonstrate Scout Spirit at all times.
- Must have proven leadership skills and abilities.
- Must provide an example for all Scouts to follow.
- Must possess and maintain the knowledge, skills and abilities required to achieve (at minimum) Star rank.

To maintain the Assistant Senior Patrol Leader position the Scout must:

- Perform the duties and responsibilities described above.
- Attend 85% of Troop meetings and 5 of the 6 Troop outings which will occur during his term of office.
- Must demonstrate Scout Spirit at all times.
- Must demonstrate his leadership skills and abilities.
- Must provide an example for all Scouts to follow.
- Must possess and maintain the knowledge, skills and abilities required to achieve (at minimum) Star rank.
